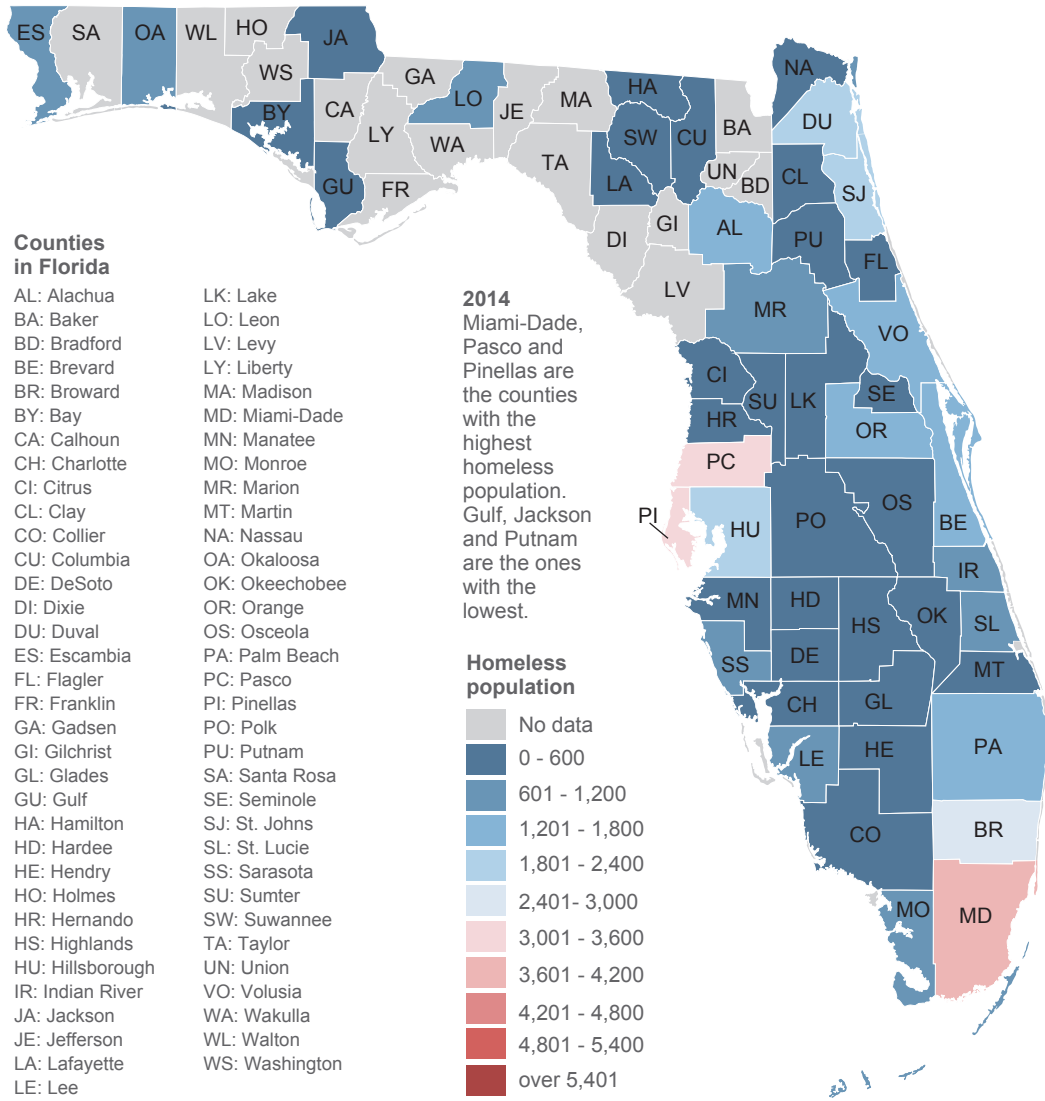


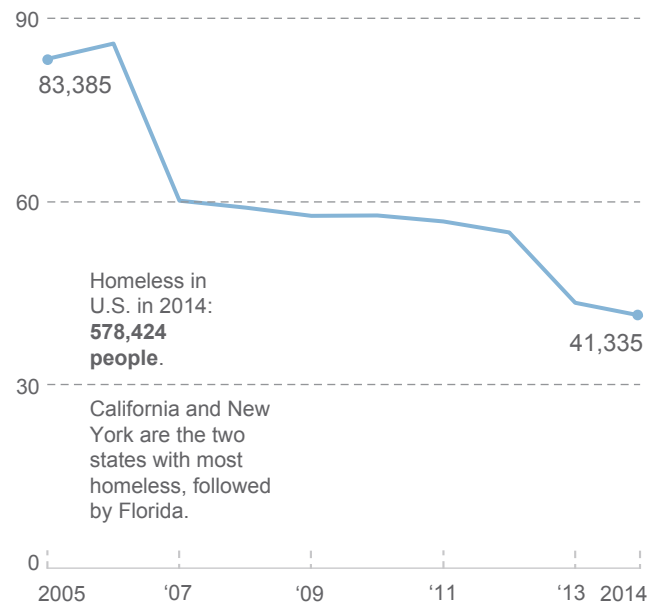
IN THE SHADOWS

In Florida, more than 40,000 people are homeless. The Sunshine State is among the top five states with the largest number of homeless people in the US. However, Florida's homeless population has declined fifty percent in the past 10 years.

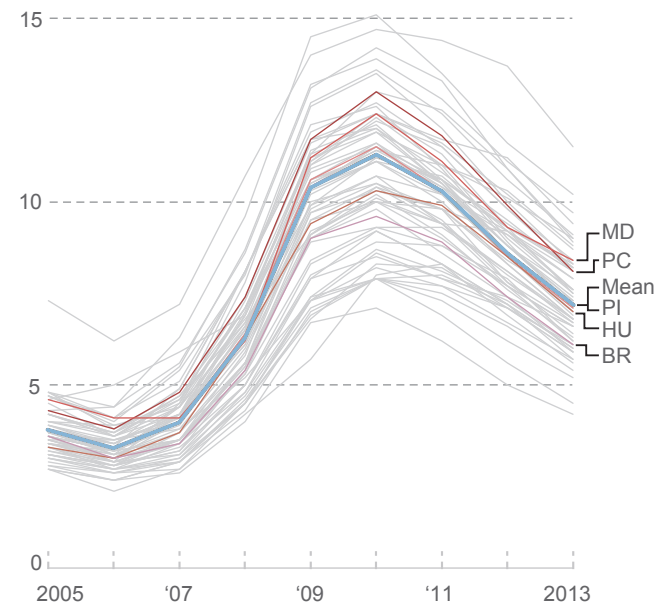

HOMELESS PEOPLE IN FLORIDA (from 2005 to 2014, in thousands)



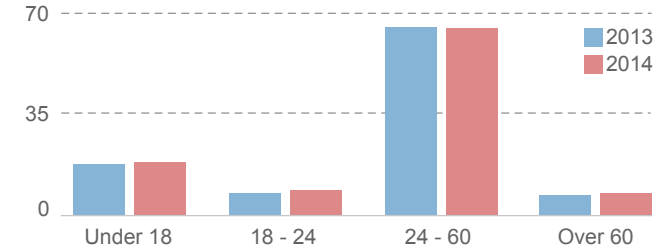
UNEMPLOYMENT BY COUNTY (as percentage)



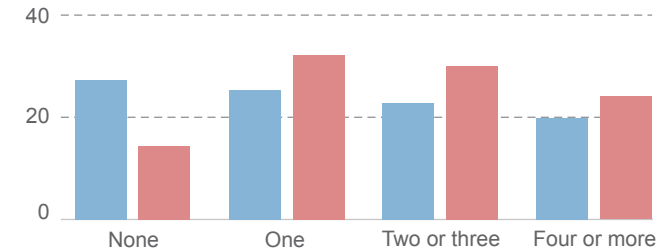
PROFILE OF HOMELESS IN FLORIDA

Thirty-five percent of homeless in the state this year are woman. Thirty-four percent are Black or African American and 14% are military veterans.

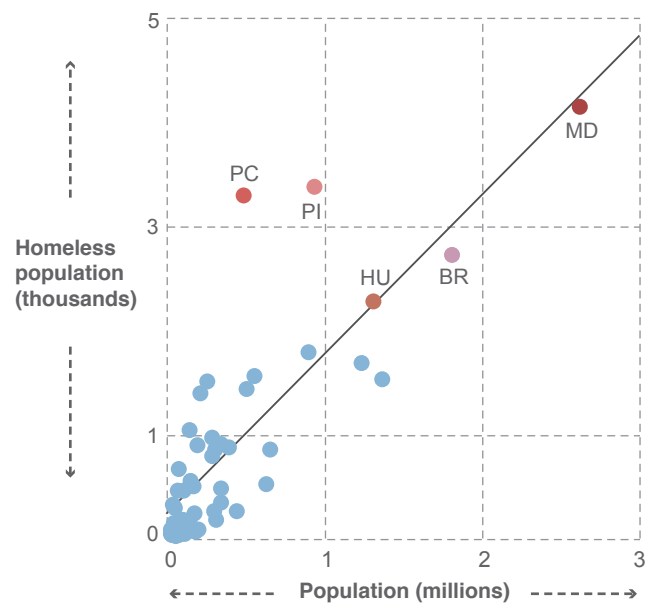
Age of homeless people (percentage)



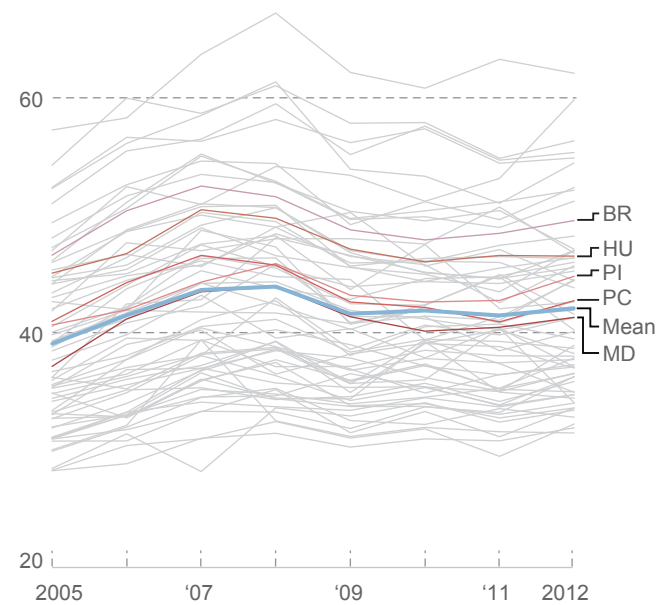
Previous episodes of homelessness (percentage)



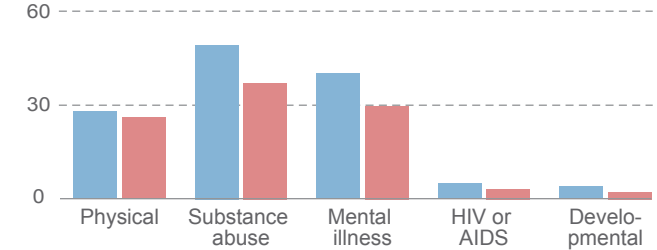
POPULATION AND HOMELESSNESS (by county in 2014)



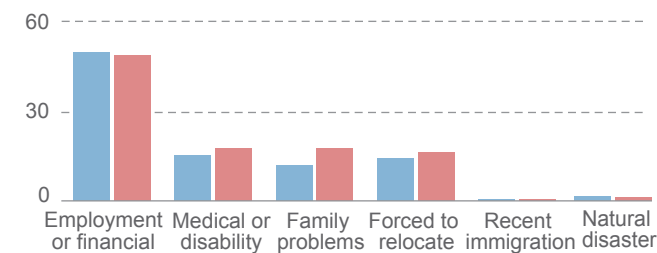
MEDIAN INCOME PER CAPITA (by county, in thousands)
